Additional Projected Revenue Sources from 2018 Regional Transportation Plan

The Regional Development Impact Fee provides one source of funding to cover the costs of the fee program projects. Each of these projects are listed on the constrained list fo the 2018 Regional Transportation Plan. The financial element of the 2018 Regional Transportation Plan has identified a sufficient pool of forecasted funding from various sources to fully fund these projects. Those funding sources include: City / County Developer Fees; FORA Capital Improvement Program Fees; Countywide Transportation Improvement Measure; Highway 156 Toll Revenues; State Transportation Improvement Program; and Regional Surface Transportation Program.
